Message from Fr. Joe



In our gospel this weekend, Jesus instructs his disciples about their responsibility as their brothers' keepers with the command, "*If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault.*" But how do we follow this command without offending other people? Yes, this command is not that easy to follow, especially since we are living in a world that thinks we should always mind our own business. But this mentality comes from a lack of courage, a lack of concern and a lack of love. If we really love a person, then we need to have the courage to tell the truth in a *spirit of compassion*, while at the same time taking into consideration the privacy of their lives. As Jesus said, "*If your brother sins against you... go and tell him his fault between you and him alone.*"

Yes, between you and him and not the whole world, which means that if we notice a person's faults or mistakes, we don't go around telling everyone. Rather, we go to them privately and speak to them with love and understanding. This is what we call "*fraternal correction.*" The goal of fraternal correction, as Jesus says in our gospel this Sunday, is "*to win over your brother,*" and not to beat him down or demean him. But the sad thing is that most of the time, this is the opposite of what we do. For most of us, we talk about people's mistakes first instead of finding out the truth. We expect the person's remorse and repentance as a price for our acceptance and love.

My dear friends, let us not forget that for Christ, **love and understanding** must come first before passing judgment. That is why he tells us to go to them privately and speak to them one-on-one. In this way, we give them the opportunity to offer an explanation for what they did without unnecessary humiliation, as they sometimes had no idea what they were doing was wrong. Remember what Jesus said when he was hanging on the cross: "*Forgive them for they know not what they are doing.*"
